

By signing this agreement, I communicate my understanding of the following:

- 1) PromiseTown Childcare Ministry & Preschool (including Summer Camp) is open from 6:30 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. Late charges will be assessed at a rate of \$1.00 for each minute after 6:00 P.M. The amount is payable directly to the staff member who had to remain to provide care and is due when the child(ren) is/are picked up.
- 2) I understand that my child will only be released to parent(s) listed on the Application for Admission form unless another person(s) is <u>named in writing</u>.
- 3) I, or a designee, am required to bring my child into the appropriate PromiseTown Childcare Ministry & Preschool classroom and must sign in and sign out the time of arrival and departure.
- 4) I consent that in case of an accident/injury or illness of a serious nature, my child will be given emergency medical treatment.
- 5) I understand that a health examination is to be completed by a Health Care Professional, including immunizations and tuberculin testing for the current year is required for my child within one month of admission and that my child will be removed from the Ministry if a health form is not returned within the required time. In addition, I understand that the health examination shall be repeated yearly.
- 6) I understand that any non-prescription medications, such as Tylenol, Robitussin, Dimetap, etc. can be administered only with written consent and instruction accompanied by a doctor or parent/guardian's signature. Medication must be labeled with the child's name, date, amount to be given, and times to administer the medication.
- 7) I understand that PromiseTown Childcare Ministry & Preschool will notify parent(s) of any significant occurrences or problems which may affect my child, including exposure to communicable diseases.
- 8) I understand that PromiseTown Childcare Ministry & Preschool will be closed on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and the day after, and the period from Christmas Eve through New Year's Eve. If these holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday, then either the Friday preceding (for Saturday holidays) or the following Monday (for Sunday holidays) will be designated as the holiday, with the exception of Good Friday. I agree to pay tuition on the holiday observations mentioned above.
- 9) I understand that it is the parent's responsibility to supply all of the day's bottles each day and that they should be properly sterilized at home each night. All bottles must be labeled with the child's name and date prepared. All baby food must also be labeled with the child's name.
- 10) I understand that parents are responsible for the diaper/pull-up supply for their child, if necessary each diaper will be labeled with the child's name.
- 11) I understand that breakfast will be served to my child upon arrival between 7:30 A.M. until 8:00 A.M.

Flow of the Day

(Hours of operation 6:30AM – 6:00PM)

Drop-off

(No Drop-off after 10:00AM without advance notice in writing)

6:30am - Office Open (all early birds will come here and then transition to their classes)

7:00am - Nursery Open (Infants & Crawlers)

7:30am - Toddlers Class Open (T1 & T2)

7:30am - Preschool Class Open (K3 & K4)

At 9:00AM the core program begins for all classrooms. While each teacher structures the day to best reflect the rhythm of the individual class community every classroom will typically incorporate the following during the core preschool hours:

- Circle Time (planning with the children, topic study discussions, sharing, stories, songs, games, etc.)
- Centers/Stations (Art, Construction, Dramatic Play, Topic Study Explorations, Books, Literacy/Message Center, Cooking, Manipulatives)
- Clean Up
- Snack (9:00AM- 9:30AM & 3:00PM -3:30PM)
- Lunch (12:00PM 1:00PM)
- Outdoor Classroom/Rec Station—nature, outdoor explorations, games, gross motor play

If you were to peek into our classrooms, you may see children involved in a morning meeting, circle time, dressing up, baking with play dough, immersed in constructing with Legos or blocks, looking at books, sorting objects, playing instruments, or drawing. You will see engaged teachers watching and listening to children, documenting their play with photos and notes, offering resources to support and extend their play, and having fun alongside them.

Pick-up

Our Pick-up procedures mirror drop-off, as children leave for the day their class sizes decrease and classes will combine.

Hello! We hope that all our Promise Town families are enjoying their summers. The start of the new school year will soon be upon us. The intent of this letter is to notify Promise Town families of a new change in our student dress code policy. We will be implementing a required uniform for all classroom K-3 and higher, with the beginning of the fall 2016 semester. Throughout the school year (Aug- May) students will need to arrive to school in their required uniform. We believe that this transition to uniforms will:

- Encourage our students to experience a greater sense of unity and belonging
- Encourage a high level of program participation
- Ensures children are wearing school and age appropriate clothing
- Instill a sense of pride and disciple among students
- Improve and expand on academic excellence
- Positively influence our school's image in the community
- Decrease morning stress in decision making about what to wear

You can find the requirements below for each classroom. Uniforms may be purchased from any retailer and brand. This policy will become **operative September 6**th for children and staff, and will be in full effect as we begin our second quarter on **Monday, October 3, 2016**. Uniform Requirements:

Please be mindful that all students will need to wear their uniform daily **and** leave at least one set at school, to serve as a change of clothes. With this is mind, we highly suggest purchasing 3-6 sets of uniforms, depending upon your child's needs.

- > K-3 Tribe of Levi: Navy Blue Polo Shirt or Collared Shirt (short or long sleeved) / Khaki colored bottoms
 - optional: Navy Blue Sweater/Cardigan
- > K-4 Tribe of Judah: Hunter Green Polo Shirt or Collared Shirt (short or long sleeved) / Khaki colored bottoms
 - optional: Hunter Green Sweater/Cardigan
- > K-5 House of David: Yellow Polo Shirt or Collared Shirt (short or long sleeved) / Khaki colored bottoms
 - optional: Yellow Sweater/Cardigan

Girls may wear pants if they choose. If skirts are preferred, they must be an appropriate length and skorts (built in shorts under skirts).

Additionally: there are no uniform required during breaks or flex weeks.

All students are required to wear rubber-soled shoes to school
